
The Social Media team has been promoting the organization and our members' works.

A member of ICWP since 2015, Rachana is the recipient of many awards and accolades. In 2017, she received the prestigious British Council Charles Wallace India Trust Grant and completed a visiting fellowship with the Trust in London. In 2018, she served as Session Chair in the International Conference on Future of Women in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia; was a member of the Scientific Committee of the 4th World Conference on Women's Studies in Colombo, Sri Lanka; and earned the Appreciation Certificate for her work with LEAD, a program of the Deshpande Foundation that offers students an opportunity to make a change in their world. Her areas of interest include Theatre, Performance and Gender Studies -- subjects on which she has authored and edited numerous books.



ICWP Radio Stages broadcast the first ICWP show on Tremella Radio. Tremella is based in Denmark but has international reach, like all digital radio.

The 30-minute show is scheduled to run every Wednesday from 18.00 to 18.30 CET (6 hours ahead of EDT).

Right now, we are re-broadcasting the podcasts that we already have published, but we are planning to produce fresh audio-based content.

Broadway and Beyond

Broadway Rebound

Just as the world was hoping to regain some normalcy after the pandemic, we are faced with another wave. This regression in reopening theater has caused some interesting trends in shows being offered on Broadway.

According to Broadway.com, approximately 80% of the shows on offer are shows which opened before COVID-19, and some are revivals, some, such as *Plaza Suite* and *Company*, originated decades ago. Ticket prices have dropped to Off-Broadway levels. Some shows are selling tickets as low as \$39 (USD). Other big-budget shows have thrown in the towel as they don't anticipate recouping, including *Frozen, Mean Girls*, and a revival of *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* (thewrap.com)

Before COVID, there were a number of new shows on the slate: nearly all of those have vanished. With theaters and commerce trying to hang on in the wake of a new virus strain, it seems that opportunities should abound for new works and producers looking for new plays and musicals that can be staged less expensively than a lavish extravaganza or star vehicle. The opposite seems to be panning out: producers and investors seem to be putting their money on the tried-and-true to get audiences back in seats. Bravo to those theaters and producers, like Ken Davenport, for taking on new works!

It seems counterintuitive to offer that those intrepid theatergoers willing to go back into close quarters more of the same fare. New York theaters have set the example of presenting brave new works—comedies, musicals, dramas—for the past century. Let's hope they don't lose that passion for the daring and original as new voices yearn to be heard and audiences seek entertainment that makes them think.



ICWP member **Shirley King** died in July in Oakland, California, USA. She was 86.

A former social worker and an alumna of UC Berkeley, Shirley came to writing plays later in life. She created a formidable work of plays, monologues, and books. In 2017, 22 performances of her plays and monologues were staged. Shirley was a member of The Dramatists Guild of America and an active member of ICWP for 20 years.

She was a beloved mentor to many artists and enthusiastically shared her knowledge and experience with emerging playwrights, whom she inspired and motivated with the message that it is never too late to write the stories we want to tell.


